What is it like and do you enjoy being Head Teacher? Mr Davies loves being a Head Teacher and he thinks it is the best job he has had.

Have you been a Head Teacher in any other schools? If yes where? He has been a Head Teacher in one other school in Twickenham.

Do you have a choice of who works here? He does and has interviewed all new members of staff apart from 3. Mr Davies said he like to meet all the people who apply for jobs here.

What's the hardest part of your job and what's the best thing about it? Hardest part of the job is to find people to work here and making sure he is finding the best people.

Do you miss teaching classes

being Head? Yes, Mr Davies was originally a PE Teacher but has also taught IT, PSHE and Geography. He is currently teaching a Year 8 Geography class.

How do you manage a big site and lots of people? He

manages it by accepting that he can't do it alone and has to ask for help from staff. There are two Deputy Heads who support him.

And now for a few personal questions:

What school and university did you go to? He went to Portland Comprehensive in Worksop and to University in Roehampton.

Have you had any other jobs other than in school? Mr Davies has had lots of jobs including



barman, chef, and even opened his own Tex-Mex restaurant where he made chillies.

What is your favourite subject? His favourite subjects are PE/Sport and History.

What were you like at school?

He was very good at school and had good attendance. Mr Davies said he loved to learn new things.

What subjects did you pick to study and how have they helped

you in your career?
Most of his friends went down the local coal mine or got apprenticeship but he didn't want to do that so he studied History, Geography and Science.

If you could go back in time and give yourself advice in Year 7 what would it be? Don't give up languages because

he misses not being able to speak a foreign language. Mr Davies can speak a tiny bit of German which he picked up from friends but would like to speak Spanish and French.
