MyED will be our main point of communication between parents & carer -messages and letters will be sent via the app, along with notifications of your child's achievements.

The app also allows you to make direct contact with school, via a messaging service, by email or by phone call.

Once you are registered, you will be directed to My School - this is the homepage for generic information.

The My Student area will be specific for your child. If data does not pull through, you will need to call the school to confirm / update your mobile phone number. The app will then sync with our database.

In the 'settings' area of the app there is an option to 'set up a pincode'. This function will stop unauthorised messages being sent from your handset.



### Sicilian Easter Break

28 students from across Year 10 and Year 11 visited Sicily over the first week of the Easter break. On the trip, we were able to experience the landscapes we had learned about in the classroom in real life.

Our first day started with a trip to Mount Etna, the biggest volcano in Europe. Climbing the volcano, we felt the temperature drop dramatically, its snow-covered peak at 3300 metres high a daunting sight as we zigzagged our way up the volcano. We saw different kinds of land forms that the volcano had created including lava tunnels, lava flows and the volcanic craters. Later that day, we then went to a town called Taormina, where we got to look at the different shops and had some Sicilian pizza.

On the second day, we took a boat trip from Sicily to the smaller Aeolian islands - volcanic islands in the sea. Visiting Lipari, the largest of the islands, we saw examples of the classical Greek and Roman architecture and enjoyed a lunch by the port before heading to Vulcano where we bathed in the thermal mud baths. The smell of sulphur was extremely strong


and it took more than one attempt to wash it off in the sea! We visited the black sand beaches on the island, presided over by the brooding volcanic crater which demonstrated its state of activity through the constant stream of gas and steam emitted into the sky above.

On our last day, we went on a long walk to a waterfall. Trekking through the Sicilian countryside surrounded by the mountains and valleys, we got to see the upper course of the river and relate it to the features we had learned about. We then got to visit the Alcantara Geology Park, where we walked through a gorge and considered the huge impact volcanic activity has had on this part of the world.

All in all, it was a very enjoyable trip. We got to see lots of amazing landscapes and experience lots of fun things.

## Looking after your welfare

#### We have two free and confidential school nurses

Our school Nurse, **Helen Snell** is in school every Wednesday. She runs a drop in clinic at first break, where students can just come along if they have any questions concerning any aspects of their health. She can also make appointments for longer, 1-2-1 sessions. If you have any questions or concerns about:


- · Self harming
- Sexual health
- · Eating/diet
- Puberty
- Periods
- Drugs/alcohol/smoking
- · Skin care
- Friendship issues

Helen can offer practical support and advice.

Dan Ellis, Sexual Health Nurse is also in school every Wednesday at second break, where he runs a drop in clinic offering:

- Free condoms/contraceptive advice
- Pregnancy testing
- STI testing
- · Emergency contraception

Helen and Dan can be found in the small office in between D16 and D17. Their clinics are free and completely confidential. Alternatively, students can speak to their Head of Year who will complete a referral, if you feel you might need a longer appointment.



An information and support network has been set up in school for our LGBTQA+ community and will provide a space to drop in for information and support. The sessions will run each Tuesday at 3 pm In the library and will be facilitated by the school counsellor and Miss Hyde from the English department. Sessions run for 45 minutes.

The meetings are informal, relaxed and confidential although usual safeguarding responsibilities will always apply.

# 'Your Future in Health & Care' - a round-up of the day.

In March, Mrs Withington attended the Health Care Careers Day at Madejski. Speakers talked about the various apprenticeships and degrees in health care. There was a big buzz throughout the day with plenty of advice on offer. Current students training within the NHS explained what they do day-today. For anyone who may not have the required UCAS points for a full degree, a new 2-year course has been introduced for those wishing to pursue a career as a nurse or health-care assistant. The

course covers all health-care assistant duties as well a basic nursing skills. After completing the 2-year course, you can then continue on to a full nursing degree in order to become a state-registered nurse. There is currently a huge shortage of Allied Health Professionals (AHPs) in the NHS.
