Picking the pathway that's right for your child



Introduction

- Time to make an important decision.
- Chance to choose 40% of their timetable for the next 2 years.
- They need to make sure that they have all the information before making an informed choice.
- They have been encouraged to discuss their options with you and their teachers to make sure they start on the right path.



Compulsory curriculum



- The compulsory curriculum equates to 30 hours out of 50 over a two-week timetable.
- It is a requirement that all pupils study the following subjects:
- English 2 GCSE's (language & literature)
- Maths 1 GCSE
- Science 2 GCSE's (Combined Science)
- It is also a requirement to follow a program of
- Physical Education
- Wellbeing



Overall aim

- We want all students to be able to follow an ambitious curriculum that is both broad and balanced through a combination of academic, creative and practical subjects, that best meets their learning needs.
- Therefore, each student has been allocated a pathway based upon the subjects they have completed across Key Stage 3.

Pathways



Pathway One

The majority of students will follow this pathway as it will lead to the completion of the EBacc, which requires them to study at least one humanity subject and one language.

Students then choose two further subjects, which we recommend come from the preference subjects, to ensure a broad and balanced curriculum, although they can choose an additional EBacc subject.

Pathway Two

Students following this pathway will be asked to choose between history or geography as a humanity subject. They should then choose three further subjects, to ensure a broad and balanced curriculum.

Students who can speak, write and understand a qualifying community language will be allocated this pathway. They will then complete the GCSE in this language at the end of year 11 and will therefore fill the EBacc requirements

Pathway Three

Students following this pathway will study Wider Key Skills as an alternative to studying a language and a humanity. In addition to this, they should choose one or two further subjects.

Types of Qualification



GCSE's

Key Features

- Majority of grade awarded is based upon performance in final exams at end of Year 11.
- Practical subjects (Art, PE, Technology) have practical component which is worth up to 40 percent
- Grades are 9 (highest) 1 (lowest)

Vocational (BTEC, WJEC, VTCT) <u>Key Features</u>

- Majority of the grade is based upon independent coursework
- Coursework is marked internally by your teachers.
- One external exam to be completed during the course.
- Exam can be repeated.
- Grades are Distinction*, Distinction, Merit and Pass

If anyone is having issues with this, they can come and see me in A105, 1st break each day and I will support them with this process.




Logging in
